

L4 route to ACCA qualification

Level 4: 15 months

Funding band (for the apprenticeship element)

- £12,000 Levy payers (subject to approval)
- 5% (£600) contribution, or free if you are a non levy paying employer and your apprentice is aged 16–21 on starting, or is over 21 and has been in the care of, or is supported by their local authority*



This route to completing the ACCA qualification includes a 15 month Level 4 Professional Accounting Technician apprenticeship that covers the Applied Knowledge level of ACCA plus two subjects from the Applied Skills level.

Upon completing the apprenticeship, learners can apply for the ACCA Diploma in Accounting and Business (RQF Level 4) and be eligible to complete the four remaining Applied Skills level exams before moving onto Strategic Professional (four exams) in order to complete the full ACCA qualification.

Which role types is the standard suitable for?

The standard is aimed at apprentices working in organisations of all sizes whether small, medium, large or global. This occupation is present in public, private, and third sector organisations. Professional accounting technicians may work in finance departments or in practice based accounting roles such as an Auditor.

Typical role titles that align with this standard are: accounts payable and expenses supervisor, assistant auditor, assistant financial accountant, assistant management accountant, commercial analyst and junior analyst.

Eligibility and exemptions

To be eligible for the ACCA Professional Accounting Technician Level 4 apprenticeship, you must be registered as a student with ACCA.

There are no academic entry requirements or age limits for Level 4 ACCA. This means that anyone can study for the Level 4, including school leavers, graduates, experienced professionals, and career changers.

Graduates who have already completed relevant accounting based degrees are not eligible for government funding on this programme.

Pathway summary

Throughout the apprenticeship, learners will be stretched and challenged to develop their technical knowledge and skills and to apply what they learn in their current role and future career.

The Level 4 Professional Accounting Technician apprenticeship provides an excellent starting route towards completion of the full ACCA qualification. Upon completion of the Level 4, learners can subsequently progress outside of apprenticeship funding to become fully ACCA qualified by completing an additional four Applied Skills exams, the ACCA EPSM module, and four Strategic Professional exams.

Level 4 pathway durations

The Kaplan pathway will be 15 months long:

Example – Apprentices would start with Kaplan in January 2026 and complete their apprenticeship by taking their EPA in March 2027.

 - Financial Reporting (Audit/Reporting Route)

Please note that the choice to complete the two Applied Skills subjects and exams is recommended for those who wish to go on and complete the ACCA qualification.

- An extremely efficient and cost effective route with the apprenticeship element incorporating two Applied Skills subjects.
- Suitable to multiple job roles including those who are both industry and practice based.

- Government funded for the first level of ACCA and two out of six subjects for Applied Skills.
