

CFAB route to ACA qualification

Level 4: 13–15 months

Funding band (for the apprenticeship element)

- £12,000 Levy payers (subject to approval)
- 5% (£600) contribution, or free if you are a non levy paying employer and your apprentice is aged 16–21 on starting, or is over 21 and has been in the care of, or is supported by their local authority*



This route to completing the ICAEW's ACA qualification includes a 13 to 15 month Level 4 Professional Accounting Technician apprenticeship that covers the Certificate Level of ACA (The ICAEW's Certificate in Finance, Accounting and Business (CFAB)), plus the first two ACA Professional Level subjects.

Upon completing the apprenticeship, learners can apply for the ICAEW Business and Finance Professional (BFP) designation. This designation provides professional recognition and access to management resources, and they can use the BFP letters after their name.

Once the apprenticeship is completed, learners can then progress on to achieve the full ACA qualification.

Which role types is the standard suitable for?

The standard is aimed at apprentices working in organisations of all sizes whether small, medium, large or global. This occupation is present in public, private, and third sector organisations. Professional accounting technicians may work in finance departments or in practice based accounting roles such as an Auditor.

Typical role titles that align with this standard are: accounts payable and expenses supervisor, assistant auditor, assistant financial accountant, assistant management accountant, commercial analyst and junior analyst.

Eligibility and exemptions

To be eligible for the ICAEW Certificate in Finance, Accounting and Business (CFAB), you must be registered as a student with ICAEW.

There are no academic entry requirements or age limits for the CFAB. This means that anyone can study for the CFAB, including school leavers, graduates, experienced professionals, and career changers.

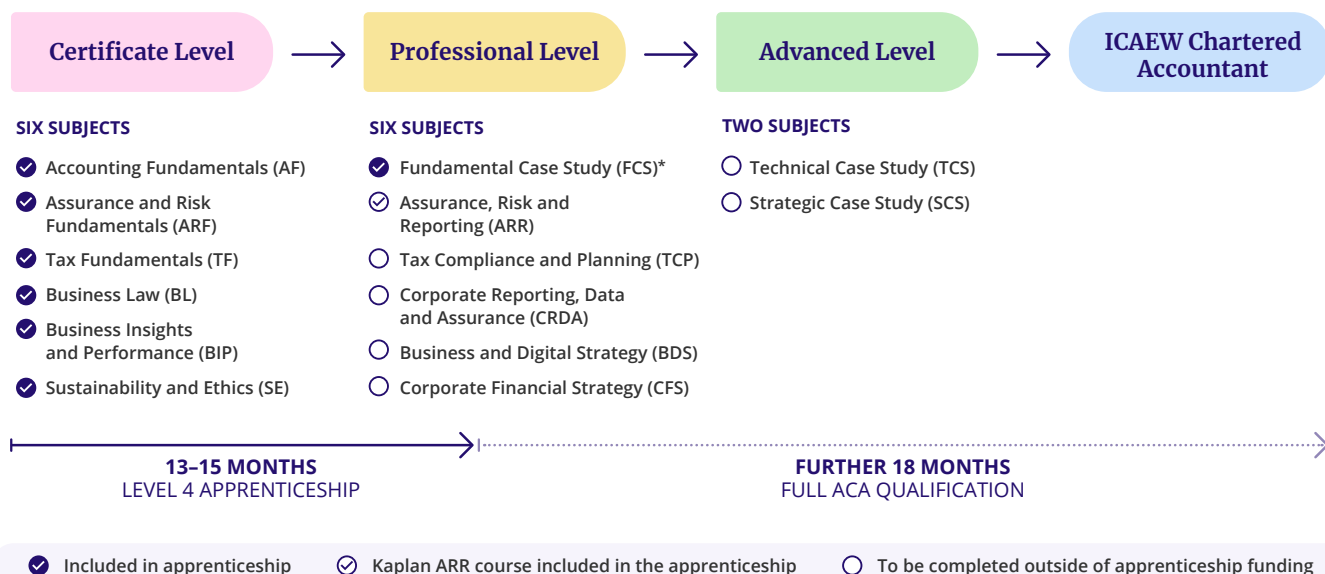
Graduates who have already completed relevant accounting based degrees are not eligible for government funding on this programme.

Pathway summary

Throughout the apprenticeship, learners will be stretched and challenged to develop their technical knowledge and skills and to apply what they learn in their current role and future career.

The CFAB pathway within the Level 4 Professional Accounting Technician apprenticeship provides an excellent starting route towards completion of the full ACA qualification. Upon completion of the Level 4, learners can progress outside of apprenticeship funding and subsequently become fully ACA qualified by completing additional Professional Level exams and two Advanced Level exams.

* Level 4 EPA is equivalent to FCS. Learners who successfully complete the Level 4 do not need to complete the FCS separately.
