### Why did you choose an Apprenticeship?

I learn best when I can apply my knowledge in practice, rather than struggling to relate in a classroom setting. Though I initially applied for university, simply because I felt this was the "expected route" to go down, I was always concerned about having debt to pay, moving away, gaining little or no experience and not having a job at the end.

My employer is really supportive, which has eased me into a work/study life balance. I am on a day release study programme, which means that around once a week I train at Kaplan

in Birmingham. They also ensure that my work ties in with my studies, which helps cement my learning.
